Firemen Ink New Pact

A new agreement signed between the Town of Riverview and its Fire Department will give a first-class fireman an average income of \$23,000.00 per year by the end of next year.

The two-year-pact was signed at ceremonies at Town Hall last Monday.

Firefighters' local Union President Al Dollement says "we're very happy the way things turned out. The atmosphere of negotiations was very good and there were no major problems."

Under terms of the agreement, the firemen will

receive a seven per cent increase retroactive to Jan. 1 and a further six per cent next year. The last contract expired at the end of 1982.

Other changes in the contract include an additional holiday, Easter Monday. The firemen now have eleven statutory holidays each year. They also get an increase in dry cleaning allowances from \$25.00 to \$40.00.

The men are members of the *International Association of Fire Fighters*.
