Dave Richardson Returned As Riverview Mayor Three New Faces To Join Him On Town Council

After three years on the sidelines, former mayor **Dave Richardson** has been re-elected to the top post in Riverview. But it was a tight race with the current mayor, Dean Johnston, and former councillor, David Burrell, both making excellent showings.

The final two mayoralty candidates, both former councillors, Brian Harquail, and Debby Warren, trailed badly for the second successive election, and were obviously out of the running from the earliest returns.

Three new faces will join Richardson for the swearing-in ceremony at Riverview Town Hall on Tuesday, May 23.

Clarence O. Sweetland, a newcomer to town politics, won Ward 4 easily over the incumbent councillor, Louise Greenwood.

Ronald J. Parlee, whose last try for a council seat was six years

ago, gave a good showing, but Downing MacDonald, who ran a quiet campaign, trailed badly in the ward.

Bob Hystop, a popular councillor, easily retained his seat in Ward 3, but his opponent Jerry R. Parlee gave him a run in

the early polls.

Tressa Lewis, councillor in Ward 1 for six years, won her seat for the third time beating newcomer Gordon Cowan by a wide margin.

Send Our Flag Proudly To Canada Day Parade

Two flags will be raised with pride at Riverview Town Hall on "Raise the Flag Day", Saturday, May 13, at 11 a.m. by Mayor Dave Richardson.

As part of a national celebration organized by the Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs of Canada, the Canadian flag, the one non-political symbol that unites all Canadians, will be hoisted to the highest flag pole.

It will be followed by the hoisting of Riverview's own town flag, which will later become part of a Canada Day parade in Ottawa on July 1.



Immediately following the flag raising ceremony, the Riverview flag will be lowered and packed for shipment to Ottawa in readiness for the July 1 parade which will be on national television from coast-to-coast.

Preceding the flag raising ceremony, a parade will be held,

starting at 10:30 a.m. from the parking lot of Riverview Mall, continuing along Coverdale Road, Buckingham Rd and Fatima to the town hall.

Young and old residents of Riverview, who are proud of their community and being Canadians, are invited to join the parade on this very special occasion.

The Riverview Kinsmen and Kinettes hope this special salute to Canada will encourage residents of the town to fly the Canadian flag outside their homes, cottages, or offices from May 13 to Canada Day, July 1.
